

# Estates, Climate Action & Sustainability Summary

Here we look at **Strategic Goal Five - Act Sustainably** in more detail

LMETB's strategy commits LMETB to:



Continue to develop and maintain the built environment to support LMETB's strategic goals,



Ensure that LMETB property is managed in a sustainable manner in line with LMETB's Sustainability Policy,



Act sustainably, in a way that is consistent with a sustainable future and consistent with Ireland's Climate Action Plan

This note summarises how LMETB goes about achieving these goals.

## 1. Estates

LMETB estates stock comprises 24 owned, 14 managed, 24 leased and 29 licenced premises throughout Louth and Meath. Management of this estate incorporates estate strategy, land acquisition/disposal, leases/licences and use of facilities.



### a. Estates Strategy:

LMETB's Estate Strategy aligns estate management with broader organisational goals, helps enhance operational efficiency, cost effectiveness and the overall sustainability of our portfolio of assets.



### b. Land Acquisition/Disposal:

Strategic development often involves long-term planning for new construction, renovations, or disposals of properties to better meet organisational needs. This might include leveraging technology for smart building management, enhancing security, and improving occupant comfort.



### c. Leases/Licences:







Sometimes it is not feasible to own the premises. LMETB then seeks to secure a premises under a lease or licence. Use of Facilities: LMETB places value and importance on making its premises available outside of school/centre hours in order to:

- support the social fabric of community life through facilitating access to local facilities;
  - help to ensure that the Government's emphasis on strong rollout of residential developments operate in a sustainable manner for local communities;
  - assist with the implementation of the Government's Climate Action Plan
- through facilitating communities with access to local facilities;
- support an active and healthy lifestyle for communities.
- In attending to the above matters, LMETB must comply with rules and regulations. These are set out in documents including The 2013 ETB Act, The Code of Practice for the Governance of ETBs and Departmental Circulars.



## 2. Climate Action & Sustainability

One of the five strategic goals under LMETB's Strategy for 2022 to 2026 is to act sustainably, in a way that is consistent with a sustainable future and consistent with Ireland's Climate Action Plan. This strategy is supported by six actions:

-  a. To develop an LMETB sustainability policy consistent with UN targets and Ireland's Climate Action Plan, including the specific targets set under that plan for LMETB
-  b. Engage with staff on implementation of LMETB's Sustainability Policy to enable them to contribute to LMETB's sustainability objectives
-  c. Engage with learners on implementation of LMETB's Sustainability Policy to enable them to contribute to LMETB's sustainability objectives
-  d. Develop partnerships, including with SEAI, which can contribute to LMETB's sustainability objectives
-  e. Ensure that LMETB property is managed in a sustainable manner in line with LMETB's Sustainability Policy
-  f. Reduce LMETB's environmental impact in line with LMETB's Sustainability Policy

Under the Climate Action Mandate 2024 as part of Climate Action Plan 2024 (CAP24), which applies to public sector organisations, LMETB must prepare a Climate Action Roadmap to report on progress towards achieving the decarbonisation and energy efficiency targets set out in CAP24. Overall, the public sector must achieve a 51% reduction in GHG emissions and a 50% improvement in energy efficiency by 2030. Each public sector organisation has been set an individual

target by the SEAI for overall GHG emissions reduction from energy. This Roadmap is a live document, which will be updated annually or as required, to reflect LMETB's progress and response to requirements under the Climate Action Mandate.

Sinead brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the role particularly in the areas of school placement and student attendance having worked as an Educational Welfare Officer with TUSLA Education Support Services (TESS) and the International Protection Accommodation Services (IPAS).

Sinead who works within the Schools Directorate LMETB under the leadership of the Director of Schools, is currently working across counties Louth and Meath with primary schools, special schools, post primary schools, PLC colleges, the National Council for Special Education (NCSE), the National Educational Psychological Services of the Department of Education (NEPS), TESS TUSLA, the Inspectorate of the Department of Education, School Management Bodies, Louth and Meath County Council Integration Teams and Bus Éireann to name but a few.






## Student Supports

**Care for students is a major priority for students attending LMETB schools and colleges. Care structures and supporting positive wellbeing are well supported by staff in key positions such as class teachers and members of the student services team including Guidance Counsellors in our post primary schools.**

LMETB schools and colleges also consider how the school community is responding to student needs and in particular those students dealing with particular challenges. Effective partnerships continue to be maintained with TUSLA Education Support Service, National Educational Psychological Services (NEPS) and the National Council for Special Education (NCSE).

## Supports for Special Educational Needs

**In all LMETB schools and colleges effective structures are in place to support students with Special Educational Needs (SEN).**

In class support and team teaching/ co-teaching models continue to be developed in our schools and colleges. Student Support Files are developed for SEN students in

partnership with students, staff, parents and external agencies working with the student including NCSE, HSE and NEPS.

We are also delighted to confirm that we have expanded our provision of Special Classes for students with Autism across schools in the two counties with a total of 41 Special Classes for the 2025/2026 academic year.

# Student Voice & Leadership

In developing leaders of the future, students attending LMETB schools and colleges have opportunities to assume leadership roles include peer mentoring programmes, Head

Boy, Head Girl, prefect system, green schools committee, amber flag committee, yellow flag committee, sports team and school digital leaders to name but a few

## Student Council

The Student Council in LMETB Schools and Colleges is a valuable resource for management, staff and students as it enables students to have an active role and voice in the many school related areas including policy making for the school. The Student Council provides a means of communication between the students, staff and management. The council have opportunities to discuss issues of concern raised by students and bring their

concerns and suggested solutions to the notice of management for consideration. The council may also organise fundraising events. The committee may also organise projects, initiatives and themed weeks in schools.

Opportunities are also provided for the Student Council to meet with the Board of Management of the school/college to discuss their plans for an academic year.





## Green Schools Committee

The Green Schools Committee in LMETB Schools and Colleges is a valuable resource for management, staff and students as it enables students to have an active role in the many areas including energy conservation, water conservation, anti - litter initiatives and recycling strategies to name but a few.

The Green Schools Committee provides a means of communication between the students, staff and management. The committee have opportunities to discuss issues of concern raised by students and bring their concerns and

suggested solutions to the notice of management for consideration.

The committee may also organise projects, initiatives and themed weeks in schools thus raising awareness and support for the Green agenda. Opportunities are also provided for the Green Schools Committee to meet with the Board of Management of the school/college to discuss their plans for an academic year. At LMETB level, an annual Green Schools Conference is held for all schools.

# Student Achievements

Numerous opportunities are scheduled in LMETB schools and colleges to reward students for their achievements and successes throughout the academic year. The school communicates successes and achievements to parents through a selection of methods including postcards home, awards ceremonies, graduation ceremonies, school newsletters, letters/notes of commendation sent home and regular updates on the school's website, Facebook and/or twitter pages. # Teaching Council

## Code of Professional Conduct

The Code sets out the standards of professional knowledge, skill, competence and conduct which are expected of registered teachers. The standards are underpinned by four core values – respect, care, integrity and trust, and reflect the complexity of teaching. Teachers should ensure that they are familiar with the Code.

The Code also has an important legal standing and will be used by the Council as a reference point in Fitness to Teach investigations. The Council has updated the 2nd edition of the Code to reflect some recent amendments to the Fitness to Teach provisions of the Teaching Council Acts 2001-2015, and a new section, entitled 'Complaints relating to registered teachers', has been added.





# Child Safeguarding

**Each LMETB School and College has a Child Safeguarding Statement which includes a Risk Assessment in place.**

The name of the designated liaison person and deputy designated liaison person for child protection and child safeguarding matters is prominently displayed in the school's reception area. All teachers are aware that they are mandated persons and of their responsibilities in that regard.

Ongoing continuous professional development is provided to the Designated Liaison Person (DLP), the Deputy Designated Liaison Person (DDL), the Board of Management, teachers as mandated persons and other school staff.

Training is provided through a combination of school training, LMETB training and training facilitated by external agencies including TUSLA, Oide Support Service of the Department of Education and Youth, and the legal services section of ETBI.

The Principal will provide a Child Protection Oversight Report to the members of the Board of Management at each meeting.

The Board of Management will also engage in a yearly review of the Child Safeguarding Statement which includes the school Risk Assessment.



and our students continue to pursue courses and careers in a range of areas.






# LMETB AMTCE FET Advanced Manufacturing Pathways Schools Project

**Now in its fourth year, LMETB's unique yearlong FET Advanced Manufacturing Pathways Schools Project is the only initiative of its kind in Irish schools, thanks to its strong partnership between FET, industry, and education.**

The project introduces Transition Year (TY) students to STEM careers while developing essential soft skills like teamwork, creativity, communication, and problem-solving.

In 2024/2025, 15 schools from Louth and Meath ETB participated.

At the Awards Ceremony in Drogheda Institute of Further Education on May 15th, students showcased innovative projects tackling real-world challenges under themes like mental health, environment, and technology. Projects were assessed by a panel of industry and education experts.

Throughout the year, students and staff availed of training at LMETB's Advanced Manufacturing

Training Centre of Excellence (AMTCE) in Dundalk in areas like 3D design and printing, VR welding, cybersecurity, and robotics.

Enfield Community College's 'Sliders' team won overall with 'SitzStand', a low-cost mobility aid. Runners-up included Dunshaughlin Community College's 'Coaster Crew' for their Parkinson's-friendly coaster and St. Oliver Post Primary's 'TG Tidy' drawing tool organiser.

Other category winners came from other LMETB schools for excellence in software, design, 3D printing, teamwork, and presentation.

LMETB Directors Sadie Ward McDermott and Fiona Kindlon praised the project as a model of collaboration, innovation, and student potential, supported by SOLAS and DFHERIS.

The judging panel featured experts from SOLAS, UCD, CDE Global, Controlsoft, and others, highlighting the initiative's strong industry-education link.




