

Course Standards and Certification

The National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ) provides a structure to compare and contrast the level and standard of different qualifications. It helps learners make informed decisions about qualification choices and to consider progression opportunities available. The NFQ also makes it easier to explain to others what qualifications someone holds or is studying for. As it is recognised at home and abroad, it can be used to compare Irish qualifications with foreign qualifications. This becomes important for anyone considering coming to Ireland or leaving Ireland for further learning or employment.

The NFQ, illustrated by the “fan diagram” below is a system of ten levels. It is based on standards of knowledge, skill and competence and it incorporates awards made for all kinds of learning. The framework covers qualifications obtained in school right through to PhD level. LMETB Further Education and Training section offers qualifications from Level 1 through to Level 6 on this framework.

Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI) is the main awarding body for courses offered in the Further Education and Training Sector in Ireland. QQI courses are accredited as both Major and Minor QQI Awards at Levels 1-6 on the NFQ.



CLASSES OF AWARD

- Major Awards: named in the outer rings, are the principal class of awards made at a level
- Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award
- Supplemental Awards: are for learning that is additional to a Major Award
- Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement
- Professional Awards: are for occupation-orientated qualifications including apprenticeships

Post Leaving Certificate Colleges

Post Leaving Certificate (PLC) courses are full-time programmes that prepare students for employment or progression to further study. Courses are designed as a progression for students completing the Leaving Certificate (including LCVP & LCA), or equivalent, or for adults returning to education. Certification is generally at QQI Levels 5 or 6. All courses include an element of work experience. Courses last for one academic year from September-May.

Courses are offered across many areas of learning including:

Apprenticeships and Traineeships

An apprenticeship is a full-time training programme that combines centre-based learning with work-based learning in a company. At least 50% of apprenticeship learning is completed in the workplace. Apprentices 'earn while they learn'. They have an employment contract and are paid a salary for the duration of their apprenticeship training. To become an apprentice in Ireland you must be hired by an employer who is approved to employ apprentices.

Apprenticeship is a fantastic way to get started in a career, by gaining practical, on-the-job experience and skills. It also offers participants the opportunity to get a internationally- recognised qualification, which is on the National Framework of Qualifications. Apprenticeships vary in length depending on the programme and last between two and four years. The minimum age to take part varies from 16-18 years but there is no upper age limit.

The main Apprenticeships offered by LMETB include

Traineeships combine learning in an education and training setting and in the workplace. They take 6 – 20 months to complete and provide learners with job-specific training at Levels 4-6 on the National Framework of Qualifications, as well as workplace coaching. They also give the learner the opportunity to gain valuable experience in real work and industry environments, which assists in enhancing skills development and employment opportunities. Traineeships are open to people over 16 years and an allowance is offered to those eligible.

Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (VTOS)

VTOS offers free, second chance education and training to adults in a supportive learning environment. It caters for adults over 21 (or their dependent spouses) who have been in receipt of a specific social welfare payment or signing for credits for at least 6 months.

VTOS offers full-time courses which help learners to develop skills for employment or Further/Higher Education. It can also prepare learners for a new career or a career change. Learners gain certification at QQI Levels 3, 4 and 5 and retain their social welfare entitlements while on the course.

Courses take place during day-time hours, from September to May over 1-2 years. Course holidays are the same as post-primary schools including mid-term, Christmas, Easter and Summer breaks.

Specific Skills Training

Specific Skills Training offers full-time and part-time courses ranging from six to forty weeks duration. Courses are offered in centre or by blended or online learning. They are designed to provide learners with a range of employment related skills and formal vocational qualifications to assist those entering employment for the first time and those wishing to upskill or reskill.

Specific Skills Training gives learners the opportunity to develop cutting edge skills and knowledge, making them more employable and enhancing their career options.

Specific Skills Training courses are free and learners may be paid a training allowance for the duration of their course. Learners can also claim an accommodation allowance if they need to live away from home for the duration of the course, or a travel allowance if relevant.

Adult Learning Service

Adult Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills

This service is for anyone who wishes to improve their literacy, numeracy or digital skills in a supportive environment. It also provides English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). The service is free and confidential and classes are designed to meet the needs of each learner. Day and evening classes are available on an ongoing basis throughout the year.

Examples of courses offered include:

- One-to one classes, where learners work individually with a tutor
- Small group classes in a range of subjects – including everyday Maths, Spelling, Reading, Writing and Using Technology
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

LMETB's Adult Learning Service also delivers family learning courses in local schools which are included in the national Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS) plan. Family Learning classes help parents and children learn together.

Back to Education Initiative (BTEI)

The Back to Education Initiative provides part-time Further Education and Training courses for young people over 16 years and adults. The aim is to give people an opportunity to combine a return to education and training with family, work and other responsibilities. BTEI courses are available to everyone and are offered in the mornings, afternoons and evenings in a wide variety of locations throughout the LMETB area. Priority is given to those whose education is below Leaving Certificate (or equivalent) level. Courses are free to anyone without a Leaving Certificate or anyone who is in receipt of, or is the dependant of, a person in receipt of a social welfare payment or medical card.

BTEI offers courses on a part-time basis leading to certification at QQI levels 3,4 and 5 and Leaving Certificate.

Evening Courses

LMETB offers FET evening courses in 5 locations in Co. Louth and Co. Meath. There is a varied range of classes on offer from hobby to fully certified courses. Classes offer learning opportunities for lifelong learners and career changers.

Fees are generally charged for evening courses. However, in some cases, deductions or subsidised fees may apply, depending on employment and/or social welfare status.

Youthreach

Youthreach is a second chance education and training programme for young people aged between 16 and 20 years who have left school with few or no qualifications. It seeks to provide learners with knowledge and skills to help them to reach their full potential and enable them to progress to further education, training and employment.

LMETB supports 8 Youthreach centres across counties Meath and Louth. Each centre offers a wide variety of both accredited and non-accredited programmes, all delivered in caring, supportive and structured environments. Programmes run from September to July each year with referrals accepted throughout the year.

Community Education Service

LMETB Community Education Service supports new and existing community groups and organisations to establish community-based education programmes. The service prioritises individuals and groups who experience educational/ social disadvantage or social exclusion. Programmes are offered on a part-time basis in non-formal, community-based settings and are intended to provide personal and skills development for group members.

The group itself has an important role in deciding the subject area of any course. The type of course offered depends on the needs and abilities of the group. LMETB Community Education Service can assist groups in assessing their needs and provide an LMETB tutor to deliver a programme with the group. Courses may be QQI accredited or non-accredited. Applications for funding are invited three times annually. Funding covers the cost of tutor payment only.

Skills to Advance

Skills for Work is available to all private and semi-private employees who meet the following criteria:


- Having few, outdated or no educational qualifications
